require thee forthw<sup>th</sup> to survey or cause to be survey'd unto  
him a Lott as convenient as may be in length & breadth as  
other Lotts of yt place are, he fencing in & building upon the  
same within six months from ye date of survey and make  
returns thereof into ye Govern<sup>es</sup> Secretary's office.
