



Survey'd and laid out in the year 1730 for William Allen of Philadelphia Esq^r a Tract of land in the County of Bucks Beginning at a post in a line of the land late of Thomas Hudson Thence south west by the same four hundred and eleven perches to a post by a small black oak then by a line of trees south east seven hundred eighty three perches to a post then north east by a line of trees four hundred and eleven perches to a post then northwest by a line of trees one hundred and eighty perches to a black oak by Mercy Phillips's land then south west two hundred and twenty perches then northwest three hundred and seventy perches, then north east two hundred & twenty perches to a black oak then northwest two hundred & thirty three perches to the place of Beginning containing one thousand four hundred and seventeen acres with allowance of six & Cent.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this twenty-second day of July 1910.
