


*Tho. Callwhilly Lott*



By vertue of a warr<sup>t</sup> from Edward Pennington<sup>Surv<sup>r</sup> Gen<sup>l</sup></sup> to me directed bearing date the 19<sup>th</sup> day of the 1<sup>st</sup> moneth 1709 I hereby certifie into his office that I have surveyed and lay'd out unto Tho. Callowhill a certaine Lot in Philadelphia bounded on the est with the Second Street from Delaware on the north with vacant Lott on the west with back Lotts on the south with Hugh Derbera Lott being in breadth 52 foot & an  $\frac{1}{2}$  and in length 303 foot & an halfe as may be seen in the figure above I say survey'd by me the the 22<sup>d</sup> day 1<sup>th</sup> mo<sup>nt</sup> 1709

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this ninth day of April 190.
