The other lies on the east side of the said second Street bounded on the east and south by the Dock and Swamp and on the North by a Lot late of the said Edward Shippen.

These are to authorize and Require thee to Resurvey or cause to be resurveyed unto the said James Hamilton according to the above descriptions and bounds the said two lots of Ground and make return thereof into our Secretary's Office in order for Confirmation and for so doing this shall be thy sufficient Warrant Given under my Hand and the Lesser Seal at Philadelphia this 14<sup>th</sup> day of December
