

Pennsylvania

By vertue of a war^t from ye Com^{tee} dated ye 24th of ye 11th m^o 1690 directed to ye Survey^r Generall I do by authority from him certifie into ye Secretaryes office that there was surveyed & laid out ye same day unto Gunnor Rambo (old Renter) three severall tracts or percills of land in y^e Township of Shakamaxonck and County of Philadelphia. The first p^{ee}ce or percill beginneth at ye mouth of Gunnor's Creek from thence running up ye severall courses of Delaware River to a corn^t post of Peter Nelson's land thence N. 16^d W¹⁴ by ye said Nelson's land 110 perches to a corn^t white oak standing near unto the afore said Gunnor's Creek from thence following downe the severall water courses thereof to ye place of begining being ffifty ffour acres of land swamp and Crible. The second p^{ee}ce or percill beginneth at a corn^t ^{post} of Jn^o Tonks land standing by ye side of a meadow thence following up ye severall courses of ye said meadow 105 perches to a corn^t of Peter Nelson's land thence N.N.W by ye said Nelson's land 177 p^{ee}ches to a corn^t tree standing by ye side of a swamp or crible thence along ye severall courses thereof to a corn^t tree of Robert Turner's land thence S. 36^d W¹⁴ by ye said Turner's land 58 perches to a corn^t post of ye afore said Jn^o Tonks land, thence S.S.E. by ye same 140 perches to ye place of begining . . . being one hundred and three acres of land. The third p^{ee}ce or percill (being swamp meadow and crible) beginneth at a corn^t post of Peter and Michell Nelson's meadow and crible thence S.S.E by ye same 104 perches to a corner post standing by ye River Delaw^r thence up ye same ffourty-one perches thence N.N.W. by a line of trees ninety-seven perches to a corn^t post standing on ye fast land of Peter Nelson thence along ye severall courses of ye said fast land to ye place of begining, being twenty-six acres Containing in all ye three afore said tracts or percills one hundred eighty-three acres which is accordingly entred & recorded in ye Survey^r Generall's office at Philadelphia.
