These are to authorize and require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be surveyed within the City of Philadelphia the front and high Street Lots appurtenant and belonging to the original Purchase of One Thousand Acres of Land made of our late Father William Penn Esq<sup>r</sup> by Edward and Isaac Martindale and also the Liberty Land belonging to the same Purchase and make Return thereof into our Secretary's Office (for the use of John Penn Esq<sup>r</sup> to whom the same doth now appertain) in order for Confirmation and for so doing this shall be thy sufficient Warrant. Given under my Hand and the lesser Seal at Philadelphia this 12<sup>th</sup> day of July
