Whereas William Penn Esq^r late Proprietary and Goverour &c. did in & by his last will & testament bearing date the 27th day of May A.D. 1712 (amongst other Bequests & Legacies) Give & Devise unto his Grand daughter Gulielma Maria Penn since intermarried with Charles Fell of the City of London Gent. the Quant^y of ten Thousand acres of Land within the said Province, And there having been surveyd in the year 1727, a Tract of land on a brach of Schuykill-call'd Tulpehocco now in the County of Lancaster computed to contain ten thousand acres since which time part thereof hath been cut off so that there now remains within the bounds & limits of the said Tract no more than nine thousand six hundred & forty acres—

Now in pursuance of a Warrant from the s^d Proprietaries dated the 10th day of October 1734 to me directed And by vertue of a Commission from the s^d Proprietaries I do hereby authorize thee to survey & lay out adjoining thereto, if so much good land can be found free from other claims & surveys, or remote therefrom; as may compleat the afores^d quantity and make a return thereof into my office dated at Philad^a the 10th of October A.D. 1735.
