At the request of John Roberts of Meirion Matter that we would grant him to take up in right of John Roberts and William Roberts who came into this Province servants to Robert David One hundred acres of land in right of William David servant to John Bevan ~~One hundred acres~~ fifty acres in right of Elizabeth Owen serv^t to the widow Thomas fifty acres & in right of Thomas David servant to s^d widow Thomas fifty acres which s^d several rights the said John Roberts severally purchased of the persons interested as by deeds under their hands & seals duly executed doth appear. These are to authorize and require thee to survey and lay out unto the s^d John Roberts the s^d several quantities of land amounting to two hundred and fifty acres in one tract where not already survey'd nor taken up nor concealed nor seated by the Indians to be held at the yearly rent of one half penny sterl. & acre and make returns thereof into the Gen^l Surveyors Office at Philad^{la} where this warr^t is to remain and a copy thereof to be deliv^r to thee certified by the secretary. Given under our hands & ye seal of y^e Province at Philad^{la} the 17th of the 6th moth 1702.
