

In pursuance of a warrant to me directed from the Commissioners of Property bearing date the fourth day of the first month Anno — 1717^{1/8} I have caused to be survey'd in the right of Ann Oliff a tract of land in the County of Philadelphia near Perkeomink beginning at a post near a black oak mark'd thence running by the land of Isaac Debey North east ffive hundred & sixteen perches to a post thence by vacant land north west one hundred & twenty two perches to a post at the corner of Limrick township thence by the land of Joseph Pike south west ffive hundred & sixteen perches to a post thence south east one hundred & twenty two perches to ye place of beginning containing three hundred & seventy acres. Survey'd ye eighteenth day of October one thousand seven hundred & twenty six.

Beside the quantity of three hundred & seventy acres there is contained within the said bounds an allowance of six acres per cent making in the whole one hundred ninety two acres.
