

Pensilv<sup>a</sup> 5s.

By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of Peter Baydeller late of Germany but now  
of this Province that we would grant him to take up two hun-  
dred acres of land near the Plantation whereon Peter Biz-  
aillor formerly dwelt on the West side of Schuylkill for which  
he agrees to pay to the use of the Proprietary Trustees six &  
thirty pounds money of Pensilv<sup>a</sup> for ye whole and ye yearly quit rent of  
one shilling Sterling for each hundred acres. These are to authorize  
and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said Peter  
Baydeller at the place aforesaid according to the method of Townships  
appointed the said quantity of two hundred acres of land that has not  
been already surveyed nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians  
and make returns thereof into the Secretary's office which survey in  
case the said Peter — fulfill the above agreement within three month  
after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void  
as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted. Given  
under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the  
9<sup>th</sup> day of December Anno Dom. 1719.
