Govern't to me directed &c I hereby authorize & empower thee
to survey and set out to Georg. Churchman twenty acres out
of the lands formerly I appointed for Richard Dynard on
the hither side of Upland Creek & let it be contiguous to the
thirty acres he bought & is settled upon. Also survey & set out
to Richard Townsend fifty acres adjacent to his house where
untaken upp, near the said creek also out of the plus lands
of Upland. Also survey and set out to Caleb Pusey tenn acres
joining to the Mill at the said Creek for the use of the Mill.
Also ninety acres not farr from the said Mill for the said
Caleb Pusey that is not taken up there, if so much in the plus
land of Upland be left, and make me a true returne of the
original field work & protracted figures which are to remain
