


Pennsylv<sup>a</sup> 55

By the Commissioners of Property

Upon an agreement now made with Hans George Shutz  
and Mathias Ringer lately arrived here from Germany for five  
hundred acres of land situate on the west side of the river Schuy-  
kill where Peter Bazaillon formerly dwelt for which they agree to pay  
to the prop<sup>rs</sup> use one hundred pounds money of Pennsilv<sup>a</sup> for the  
whole and the yearly quit rt of one shilling sterling for every hun-  
dred acres. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or  
cause to be surveyed unto the said Hans George Shutz & Matt. Rin-  
ger in the place af<sup>d</sup> according to the method of townships appoint-  
ed the quantity of five hundred acres of land including within the  
said survey the plantation & improvements where the said Peter  
dwelt & make returns thereof into the Secretaries office which said  
survey in case the sd Hans George ~~Shutz~~ & Mathias or either  
of them pay down upon the return of the said survey now imme-  
diately to be made forty pounds & the remaining sixty pounds  
on the sixteenth day of November next ensuing after the date  
hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had  
never been made nor this Warrant ever granted. Given under
