

By Virtue of a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property bearing date the 24<sup>th</sup> of the ninth Month 1702 for Laying out unto Joseph Pike of the Kingdom of Ireland Merch<sup>t</sup> a Thousand acres of Land above What has been already taken up or granted to the said Pike Purchaser of five thousand under Samuel Rolls Original purchaser of the said Quantity of the Proprietary the said Warrant Granted at the Request of Thomas Story Attorney for the Said Joseph Pike.

Surveyd and Laid out the 24<sup>th</sup> of the 4<sup>mo</sup> 1703 unto the Said Joseph Pike The said quantity of one thousand acres of land in the County of Philadelphia beginning at a Hickery tree at the Corner of Joseph Grondon's land Thence running by the line of the Same Grondons land North nine hundred and Sixty perches to an Elm tree Thence East by vacant land one hundred Sixty seven perches to a post Then South by other land of the Said Joseph Pike nine hundred and Sixty perches to a post then <sup>West</sup> by vacant land one hundred and Sixty seven perches to the place of the beginning of David Powel
