By the Commissioners of Property.

At the request of Isaac Self of Market Lavington in the County of Wilts in Great Britain by his Attorney George Chandler of the County of Chester that we would grant him to take up two hundred and fifty acres of land purchased by him of the Proprietor.

These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd to the said Isaac Self the said quantity of two hundred and fifty acres of land in this Province that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make a returne thereof into the Secretary's office in order to a further confirmation.

Given under our Hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the fifteenth day of the seventh month Anno Dni 1713.
