At the Request of Randal Spakeman Administrator on the Estate of Daniel Smith deceased That We would grant him to take up five hundred Acres of Land over and above two thousand now granted for the Uses of the said Daniels Estate and in ^{of right or several} mean purchases made by him of Original Purchases from the Proprietary in England: These are to Authorize and Require thee forthwith to Survey and lay out (according to the Method of Townships) to the said Randal for the Uses aforesaid five hundred Acres of Land in the Province where not already survey'd nor taken up nor is concealed nor is seated by the Indians And make Returns in the General Surveyors Office at Philadelphia where this Warrant is to remain and a Copy thereof to be delivered to thee certified by the Secretary which Survey in case the sd Land be improved and Settled within 18 months after the date of Survey shall be Valid otherwise void & of no Effect. Given under our hands & the seal of the Province at Philad^{la} the 6th of the 2^d Moth 1702.
