and Counties annexed.

These are to require thee forthwith to resurvey or  
cause to be resurvey'd a certain tract of land adjoyning on  
the river Skuykill laid out to Swan Andrew & Woolly Swansons  
for 600 acres & in case of any considerable overplus to cutt  
off the same from the sd tract where it adjoyns on my manner  
leaving the sd number of 600 acres with 20 more to be allowed  
for roads &c. and make returns thereof into my Secretaries  
office.

Given under my hand & Seal the 20<sup>th</sup> of July 1701.
