By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of James Shattick and Edward Lane of the County of Philad^{ia} that we would grant them to take up four hundred and eighty acres of land remaining untaken up of one thousand acres originally purchased by Thomas Pearce of L^ymerick in the Kingdom of Ireland to w^{ch} thousand acres they have now purchased the whole right.

These are to authorize and require thee to survey & lay out to the said James Shattick and Edward Lane in the right aforesaid according to the Method of township appointed the said quantity of four hundred and eighty acres of land in this Province that has not been already survey'd nor is conceal'd nor seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretaries office.

Given under our hands and Seal of the said Province at Philadelphia the twenty sixth day of the second month called April in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eight and in the seventh year of the reign of our Sovereign Lady Anne of Great Britain &c Queen
