At the request of Thomas Story of Philadelphia that we would grant him to take up that vacant piece of ground lying contiguous to the northern bounds of the sd City upon Vine street to be inclosed by the said street and Joseph Willcox's Ropewalk North and South and by the lott lately granted him at the back of ~~William~~ Welle's lots and the fourth street continued on the East & West bounds for which he has agreed to pay one shilling sterling for every twenty foot thereof in breadth on the sd Vine street for a yearly rent forever.

These are to authorize and require thee to survey and lay out to the said Thomas Story the said piece of ground bounded as aforesaid and make returns thereof into the Secretaries office.
