of O Ormsby & Isaac Gregg humbly shew

That some time in the year 1792 the  
Widow of Langhlin McLean & wife a tract of  
Donation Land, lying in the 10th District, patented  
in the name of William Hopkins and by  
said Hopkins conveyed to said McLean, and  
by said McLean & wife conveyed to O Ormsby  
one of your petitioners, shortly after our  
purchase we forwarded the said Patent &  
assignments to Robert Brown at the White  
Hors in Philadelphia, requesting him to  
look it with the proper person, or at the  
proper office for renewal, agreeable to  
notice given in the Public Prints for  
all persons holding Patents for Donations  
Lands granted by the State of Pennsylvania  
and which were found to be laid with in  
the State of New York, and amongst  
others that granted to William Hopkins was  
designated, Your petitioner told the  
Respective of said Robert Brown that he  
did receive said Patent and did agreeably  
to our Request lodge it either with the  
Secy of the Commonwealth or at the office  
of the Surveyor General, and which has  
not since been found although repeatedly  
applied for, and searched after  
Your petitioner entered a caveat in
