Personally came before me one of the  
Justices of the peace for said County, Pennsylvania.  
William Martin of Mifflin County & being sworn as Law  
Directors Depoeth & saith that he was well acquainted with  
Robert M. Culley a Soldier in the late war with great Britain  
And also well acquainted with George M. Culley and Hugh M. Culley  
Brothers to the said Robert M. Culley, and also with Agnes M. Culley  
(now Toddhunter) Sister to the said Robert M. Culley, & the said  
Robert M. Culley being a Sergeant at the time of Marching  
out, And, Robert M. Culley and this Deponant were both  
Enlisted and went out together from Carlisle on the year 1776.  
& in Capt. Wm. Butters Company then in the second Regiment  
Commanded by Col. St. Clair, and from thence we marched to  
Philadelphia, New York, Albany, Fort George, Ticonderoga, Crown  
Point, St. Johns, Chamblay, to the mouth of Swirell River, to the  
City of Montreal, to Sable fort, to St. Anns. And the said Deponant  
further saith that the said Robert M. Culley on his Return home at  
Ticonderoga Received an Ensigns Commission and Died in the Town  
of Bethlehem in the State of Pennsylvania in the year 1777, as  
said Deponant Believes as he was present in Philadelphia  
When a certain George Grier, Who was left to take care of said  
Robert M. Culley, Come with the clothes & sword of the said Robert  
to his Brother George, (Who was then a Lieutenant) & said he  
Died as above mentioned. — Wm. Martin
