The Petition of the Subscriber Humbly Sheweth

That William Moody late a Soldier in the first Regiment of the
Penn^a. line, was entitled to a Tract of 200 Acres of Land from this
State as had Compensation for his services as a Soldier during the
Revolutionary War. That Number 430 in — District was drawn
opposite to his name. That said Moody did convey said all his
Right Title Interest Claim and demand to Henry Huple who
by Deed sold Grants the same to your Petitioner.

That Thomas Keiland late a Soldier in said first Regiment,
was also entitled to 200 Acres of Land as a Soldier's part Compensation
for his services as a Soldier in the said Revolutionary War. That
A²⁵ Lot in the first District of Donation Lands was drawn
opposite to the name of the said Keiland, but owing to an inadvertence
of the persons conducting the business, the said Tract has been
Patented to Francis Thornbury late Lieutenant, as will appear by the
Statement from the Office of the Secretary of State accompanying
this Memorial. That on an Examination of the files of the Office
of the Secretary of the Commonwealth, there are found Deeds
claiming the said Lands alleged to have been Executed by the
said William Moody and Thomas Keiland to Abel Tower late
of the City of Phila^a. Broker.

Your Petitioner therefore prays that
your Honorable Board will take the premises into consideration
and grant such Relief as you in your Wisdoms may think
just and your Petitioner as in duty bound will pray
