In the tenth District of the Donation Lands Beginning at a Sugar tree the numbered corner, and running East by Sol. N. 212 Two hundred and sixty one perches to a Sugar, thence South by Sol. N. 2144 One hundred and thirty perches to a Birch, thence West by Sol. N. 2122 Two hundred and sixty one perches to a Birch, thence South by Sol. N. 2116 One hundred and thirty perches to the place of Beginning containing two hundred acres and allowance of six per cent for Roads see numberd MM CXXI

his heirs and assigns forever:

with its appurtenances unto the said Thomas Jenny his heirs and assigns forever,

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract or parcel of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the

said Thomas Jenny his heirs and assigns, to the proper use and behoof of the said

Thomas Jenny his heirs and assigns forever, free and clear of all restrictions and

reservations as to mines, royalties, quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth

part of all gold and silver ore for the use of this commonwealth, to be delivered at the pit's mouth
