To all to whom these Presents shall come GREETING:

KNOW YE,

Murray Lieutenant Colonel

That in consideration of the services rendered by Francis

in the late army of the United States

there is granted by the said commonwealth unto the said Francis Murray

a certain tract or parcel of land lying in the county of Westmoreland

and in the 10th District of donation Lands Beginning at a Spruce and running North
by Vacant Land one hundred and Sixty two Perches and five tenths of a perch to a Sugar tree thence East by Lot
N° 200 two hundred and Sixty one Perches to a Sugar tree thence South by Lot N° 199 one hundred and Sixty
two Perches by five tenths of a perch to a Beech tree thence West by Lot N° 201 two hundred and Sixty one
Perches to the place of Beginning Containing Two Hundred and fifty Acres and allowance
of sixp Cent for Roads &c Numbered CCVII.

with its appurtenances unto the said Francis Murray his heirs and assigns forever:

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract or parcel of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the
said Francis Murray his heirs and assigns, to the proper use and behoof of the said

Francis Murray his heirs and assigns forever, free and clear of all restrictions and
reservations as to mines, royalties, quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth
part of all gold and silver ore for the use of this commonwealth, to be delivered at the pit's mouth
clear of all charges. IN WITNESS whereof The Honorable Charles Biddle
Esquire, Vice President of the Supreme Executive Council, hath hereunto set his hand, and caused
the state seal to be affixed the Ninth day of October in the year of our Lord one
thousand seven hundred and eighty six and of the commonwealth the Eleventh.
