Dear Madam:

Referring further to your letter received at this office September 24th, in which you requested Civil War records of William T. De Havenand Jacob E. Whittle, and our reply of September 25th, you are advised that we have made an extensive search of records in this office and were unable to locate the services of any men named William T. De Haven or Jacob E. Whittle.

We have located the name of William H. DeHaven which appears in three different organizations, namely: Company F, 25th Penna. Vulntaer Infantry (3 Mos.1861), Company B, 127th Penna. Volunteer Infantry (1862-1863), and in Captain Sanno's Independent Company of Cavalry (100 days, 1864). An investigation conducted with the War Department discloses the fact that the first two services apply to the same man and, by reason of age and place of enlistment, this office holds there is considerable probability that the last service also refers to the same man. The War Department in their search was also unable to locate any man named William T. DeHaven, from Pennsylvania, as having service named William I. DeHaven, from Pennsylvania, as having service during the Civil War. By reason of these facts this office holds that an error was made in furnishing the middle initial of this man and we are forwarding certificates covering the services of the said William H. DeHaven.

As stated above, we were unable to locate the service of a Jacob E. Whittle. We have located the service of a Jacob H. Wittle (not Whittle) who served in Company C, 201st Penna. Volunteer Infantry. Records in this office show that this this Jacob H. Wittle was born in Dauphin County and that his enlistment was credited to Derry Township of that county. As no other Jacob Whittle or Wittle from Dauphin County could be located in our files, it is presumed this record refers to the man in whom you are interested and a certificate of Jacob H. Wittle's service is also inclosed. also inclosed.
