Dear Mr. Godshall:

Application of the Township of Marple (Delaware County) for a Commission grant toward the cost of plans for a comprehensive sewer system has been considered by the Post-War Planning Commission.

I am sorry to inform you that your application had to be denied because of insufficient funds available in Delaware County. In taking action on county applications, the Commission gave priority to those received before its dead-line of October 1, 1945, for filing applications. The county allotment was exhausted before applications received subsequent to that date could be considered.

Should additional future appropriation be made by the General Assembly, or if current funds are made available because of proffered grants not being accepted, your application will be reconsidered by the Commission.

It is suggested that if the proposed work involves a sewage treatment plant or appurtenance, thereto, your authorities should file an application for grant from the Sanitary Water Board of the State Department of Health for that phase of your project.
